### CAMP STANDING ORDERS

1. THE SCOUT LAW IS THE LAW OF THIS CAMP.
2. TREES standing (alive or dead) will not be felled or trimmed nor mutilated. Firewood is available from the Wood Store open daily :-  
7.30 a.m. to 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.
3. REFUSE - Burn all refuse - tins to be burnt out and bottles washed and placed in receptacles provided and then taken to the Camp Dump. Only 'wet' pits to be dug. (NO dry pits).
4. FIRE - Only fires allowed for cooking purposes. No fires allowed in the woods.  
Fire Alarm - continuous ringing of camp bell.  
Take care with all paraffin lamps and cooking stoves.
5. MEDICAL ATTENTION can be obtained at any time. Routine treatment after inspection. (Report to Duty Scouter at First Aid Tent). Serious accidents must be reported to the Camp Warden.
6. CAMP BOUNDARIES must be strictly observed. See Map on main Camp Notice Board.
7. No Scout will leave the camp without permission from the Scouters. Full Scout Uniform must be worn when outside the camp boundaries.
8. There will be no noise after lights out, until Reveille.
9. The Store Tent and Cooking Area is out of bounds except to the Duty Patrol.
10. CAMP PROVIDORE selling sweets, soft drinks, etc. is open as follows :-  
Daily 8.30 a.m. to 9 a.m. for Milk, Bread and Provisions only.  
11 a.m. to 12 noon  
6 p.m. to 6.30 p.m.  
3 p.m. to 4 p.m. (Saturday and Sunday only).

A Camp Spending Bank will be arranged for all Scouts to deposit their money for safety.

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Note : The term "Scouter" means Mr. P.C. Watts or Mr. A. Verheul or their Assistants.

## KAMPREGELS

DE WET VAN HET KAMP IS DE PADVINDERSWET.

De bomen op het kamp terrein (levend of dood) mogen niet omgehakt of beschadigd worden. Brandhout is beschikbaar van het hout magazijn, dagelijks geopend van 7.30 uur tot 8.00 uur en van 17.00 uur tot 17.30 uur.

AFVAL - Verbrand alle afval - Blikken worden uitgebrand en flessen omgespoeld en in verzamelbakken gedaan en naar de kamp afvalplaats gebracht, Alleen natte afval wordt begraven (geen droge afval).

VIJVER Vuren zijn alleen toegestaan om te koken. Geen vuur mag in het bos worden gestookt.

Brand Alarm voortdurend luiden van de kamp bel.

Weest voorzichtig met olie lampen en kookplaatsen.

MEDISCHE VERZORGING kan altijd verkregen worden. Routine behandelingen na de inspectie (Bij de dienstdoende verkenners in de eerste hulp tent). Ernstige ongelukken moeten aan de kampbeheerder worden gemeld.

KAMPSTERREIN GRENZEN moeten zeer stipt in acht worden gehouden. Zie de kaart op het centrale kamp mededelingen bord.

Geen verkenners mag het kamp terrein verlaten zonder permissie van een van de leiders. Buiten het kamp terrein is volledig verkenners uniform verplicht.

Er wordt geen lawaai gemaakt tussen 'licht uit' en reveille.

De voorraad tent en de centrale kookplaats zijn alleen toegankelijk voor de dienst patrouille.

De kampwinkel verkoopt snoepgoed, frisdrank enz. De kampwinkel is als volgt geopend.

Dagelijks van 8.30 uur tot 9.00 uur alleen voor brood, melk en etenswaar.

11.00 uur tot 12.00 uur

18.00 uur tot 18.30 uur

Zaterdag en Zondag van 15.00 uur tot 16.00 uur
